Tuesday, November 9, 2021

Call to Order: Mayor Dennis Bardsley called the meeting to order on November 19, 2021, at 6 p.m.

Need to discuss at future meeting a December housing TIF agreement for Fieldcrest Phase 4 Housing Subdivision. *There were no other public comments received by city hall.*

<u>Friends of Underwood Possible Full Side Building Mural Request/Approval:</u> Kristen Bladt discussed the beginning vision of a potential wall mural for either the Fire Station or another building within Underwood. She, along with Friends of Underwood, will continue to do research. City Hall had been in contact with the Fire Chief prior to the council meeting.
