Current rabies certificates signed by a Veterinarian are required. If you licensed your dog last year with the city, and the rabies certificate has not expired, please note that on the application.


Please license by 2/29/2024. Beginning March 1 a \$10 penalty per dog will apply.

***Call Iowa One Call 511 prior to digging to ensure locates for utilities are completed. You don't want to hit a sewer line, power, natural gas, cable or internet.

Tornados, Sirens, Winter Weather

Tornado sirens: Frequently asked questions

When are Sirens sounded? Sirens are sounded when the National Weather Service observes conditions on radar that indicate a possible tornado has developed or is likely to develop and issue a Tornado Warning. Sirens may also be activated when trained public safety storm spotters observe a tornado or a rotating, lowering funnel cloud.

Additionally, public safety officials can have sirens sounded for extreme wind events such as straight line winds expected to be near or in excess of 80 mph.

What should I do when the sirens sound? Do not go outside to see what the weather is doing!

Tornados are very difficult to predict and development can occur very rapidly.

SEEK SHELTER IMMEDIATELY!!!!!

When is it safe to leave Shelter? Once sheltered, remain there. Monitor local AM/FM radio reports, television reports, or a NOAA Weather Radio. These media outlets will notify you when the tornado threat has passed and it is safe to leave your shelter.

SIRENS WILL NOT BE SOUNDED AGAIN TO LET YOU KNOOW IT IS "ALL CLEAR"

Sirens will sound for three (3) minutes. This is your notice to immediately seek shelter. If the sirens sound again it indicates that the tornado warning has been extended, a new warning has been issued, or a tornado has been spotted and verified on the ground near the area.

Don't forget we are still in Winter officially. THANKS TO EVERYONE FOR KEEPING THEIR CARS OFF THE STREETS WHEN THERE WAS A SNOW PROCLAMATION.

YARDWASTE PROGRAM GUIDELINES

SERVICES:

Curbside Yard Waste Service Dates: April 1-October 31, 2024

Yard waste will be picked up the same days as recycling. (Yard waste must be at the curb the night before.)

YARD WASTE BAGS OR YARD WASTE TAGS



- Yard waste must be placed securely inside biodegradable yard waste bags. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be accepted.
- <u>Bags must not weigh more than</u> 40 pounds.
- Branches and brush must be placed in yard waste bags.
- Branches must be 2 inches in diameter or less. Bundles must not be more than 4 feet long and must not weigh more than 40 pounds.

Payments to MTS and bring to City Hall by Wednesday, 4/3.

Will Take:

Regular items:

Furniture, newsprint, aluminum cans, tin cans, etc.

Appliances: There will be a \$20 charge per appliance. They do not need to be degassed.

Will not Take:

Glass of any kind, car batteries, tires, batteries, dirt, oil, paint or paint products unless in hard form, large piles of wood (example: from construction or deconstruction), waste, rocks or concrete. No excessive piles please. Only items within city limits will be taken and NO outside garbage.

Items MUST BE at the curb Friday evening. MTS will begin pickup at 11 p.m.

YARD WASTE IS DEFINED:

Grass, Leaves, Garden Waste, Twigs, Brush, and Branches 2 inches or smaller in diameter.

UNACCEPTABLE MATERIAL:

Litter, Trash, Garbage

Street Sweepings, Sand

Kitty Litter, Pet Manure

Any of the above items co-mingled with yard waste

Un-bagged or unbundled items -Bags/ Bundles in excess of 40 pounds

Bundles over 4 feet in length / Branches over 2 inches in diameter

WHAT TO USE

You may choose to purchase "IWS" bags or bags of your choice. If you choose to purchase your own bags they MUST have an "IWS" tag on them.

Bags may be purchased for \$11.25 per bundle of five

Tags may be purchased for \$8.75 per bundle of five
